

## Call for Abstracts | Punishment and Society ECR Symposium | August 2023

This is an open call for abstracts for a two-day event for Early Career Researchers (ECRs) who research punishment.

**Location:** University of Strathclyde. We are excited to welcome you to this **in person** event! We will offer a small number of online slots for researchers from our SCCJR International partners to present their work if it is not possible to travel, but we very much hope you will be able to join us in Glasgow. We do not plan to broadcast the event online.

**Date:** 3-4 August 2023

**What:** This symposium aims to develop a constituency of ECRs interested in punishment by providing a forum to present and receive feedback on ongoing work. We define punishment broadly as we are interested in inter-disciplinary perspectives on all systems and practices of punishment within, as well as outside, the criminal justice system – such as prisons, probation, electronic monitoring, as well as housing policy, immigration detention, benefit sanctions, or health inequalities, for example.

Abstracts should be no longer than 200 words. All participants will be asked to present a 15 minute paper on one of the two days.

**Who:** We also define ECR widely, and this network is open to anyone who feels they identify with this career stage. The event is for ECRs as ECRs often lack the time and support required to develop their research work and academic networks. In response to those challenges, this is intended to provide a dedicated space to support for ECRs' scholarly work.

**Funding:** The event has been made possible through funding from the SCCJR. There will be no conference fee and all catering will be provided for.

While we cannot pay for all attendees' travel and accommodation, we do have a small amount of financial support available for those who require contributions toward travel, childcare or other expenses to attend. When submitting your abstract, please do include what financial support you require, and how this will be spent and we will do our very best to facilitate your attendance.
